The data can be accessed and downloaded from the Harvard Dataverse.</p> <p>LMP – The Local Manifesto Project</p> <p>The Local Manifesto Project (LMP) collects and analyzes parties’ electoral manifestos. The project is inspired by similar projects that have analyzed party manifestos at the national and regional level. Analyzing local party manifestos is particularly important as we lack systematic and comparable information about party competition at the local level. The analysis of local party manifestos can be a solution to this lack of data. The LMP offers a graphical user interface (GUI) to the database and allows applying common text analysis methods to the text corpus.
